Police Forms

Documents for NSW firearms permits and entry into Australia are as follows.

The firearms permit fee for New South Wales is AU\$75.00

1. Everyone is required to fill in the form General Application to Import B709
and for Rifle and Shotguns, a Category A, B & C Firearms and Parts
or for Pistol a Category H Form

2. If you are carrying Ammunition you are also required to fill in an Ammunition only B709

3. You also require both of these forms which are found on the link below.
 - a. Overseas (Temporary) Visitors Competitor Legitimate Reason Form

You are required to send a copy of your passport, NZ Firearms License, club registration, and driver's license if you have one. These can all be emailed in to permits@police.nsw.gov.au Payment is by credit card as per one of these forms.

Ok, now for customs (These forms will be attached)

For each athlete, if they do not already have a CCID – a client ID for the Integrated Cargo System, a completed B319 is required

Attachment No1) b319

The completion of a B319 requires a 100-point Evidence of Identity Check – made up from a primary document commonly a Passport **and** a Drivers' Licence.

Attachment No2) B200A

The Export Application B957 **and** Supplementary page –B957a (if required)

Attachment No3) B957 Export Declaration

Attachment No4) B957a Export Declaration – Supplementary page

Attachment No5) Export Declaration Guide

NOTE: If you are submitting the export documentation on behalf of each individual, then we require a copy of your Evidence of Identity as well.

Please also be advised that an RGP once processed is only valid for 28 days therefore it will not be processed until closer to the time.

FYI – Below is additional advice from Australian Customs 26th June 2019

In order to export your firearms, parts and accessories from Australia the following documentation is required to be produced:

- Evidence of Identity (100 points) documentation – Passport Identification page and Drivers Licence (please include both sides of your Drivers Licence for address verification);
- Current Firearms Licence;
- Certificate(s) of Registration for all applicable firearms;
- B957 Export Declaration & B957A Export Declaration Supplementary Page (if required) declaring all firearms, parts and accessories;
- Defence Export Permit OR DEC07 – Restricted Goods permit (RGP)), **refer to conditions of use**
For 2019 Oceania we will use the RGP Option
- B319 – Registering as a client in the ICS
If you have not already registered and an importer/exporter – you must do this
- Statement of reason for export/Proof of entry in an overseas competition or hunting activity
- *Import documentation – B709A Importation of Firearms Police Confirmation and Certification & NSW Police Commissioners Permit.*

You must register as a client in the Australian Border Force (ABF) Integrated Cargo System (ICS) to apply for a Defence Export Permit and to lodge export declarations by document - Form B319 attached.

There are two means of which you can receive permission to export firearms out of Australia.

To apply for a Restricted Goods Permit (RGP) with the Australian Border Force. A RGP can only be granted by the ABF for bona fide travellers who are taking with them a small quantity of (up to four) Category A, B or H firearms, along with their parts, accessories and a small quantity of ammunition, to participate in activities such as taking part in a sporting event or hunting activity.

Please note the conditions of use for exporting firearms on a RGP. The RGP is valid for 28 days from the date of issue and is generally issued 10 days prior to departure from Australia.

Either an **RGP** or Defence Export Permit is required to export firearms from Australia.

All documents may be lodged together for processing prior to your travel.

The RGP can only be authorised up to 28 days prior to departure.

The Export Declaration will be lodged within approximately 14 days of the date of export.

When your Export Declaration is processed you will receive an Export Declaration Advice and authorised RGP for export.

These documents along with your Passport and Firearms Licence are to be presented with the Firearms to the Border Force Office located in the International Terminal at the port of departure, prior to departure for authorisation.

When this is completed you will then be escorted by Border Force to the Airline Check In.

Please allow sufficient time for this process to be completed as the Border Force Office can become quite congested prior to flights.

Please note, the B319 client registrations and any subsequent export documentation is to be lodged and processed from the intended port of departure.
